

#### Growing Up Wild and Flying Wild Educator Training





species whose population helps reflects ecosystem health. MCBP staff, the Shellfish Division from MD DNR, and Captain Brian and Buddy of the "Riptide" collected the first hard clam count for this season's survey from the Chincoteague Bay. An average count per square meter is taken for each bay, and it is from this that the report card score is derived (compared against historic data). As the clams "ride" up the conveyor, the scientists quickly grab them off to be measured. Anything else on the conveyor immediately returns to the bay. Once data has been taken on each clam, they too, are returned to the bay! Earth Day Clean Up




