One of the largest state environmental education conferences in the nation, MAEOE brings in over 500 teachers, educators, and scientists from the surrounding states for four days of expertise and resource sharing, networking, and communicate advancements in student and community impact. This year, MCBP also offered Educator Scholarships, and were honored to support the attendance of two local Worcester County public school teachers, Mandi Wells (Stephen Decatur High School) and Ashley Streebig (Snow Hill High School).



Thanks to our Seal Stewards, she was kept safe until a plan was made to collect her as she was determined by National Aquarium staff to be underweight and dehydrated. She is currently in rehab and has been named Amelia. More seal sightings have occurred on Assateague and the State
